


Total credit hours for the Bachelor's program in Applied Linguistics=133.
In this example, the student has completed 31 hours, and has 102 hours remaining.

The hours are distributed among a number of academic courses in the following groups.

Compulsory Courses: A group of courses that a student must complete to fulfill the requirements of the bachelor's degree. The number on the right indicates the total hours for this group, while the number on the left indicates the hours the student has completed.

For example, 108-29 means the student has completed 29 credit hours out of a total of 108 credit hours, leaving 79 credit hours to be completed in this group of courses.

Elective Courses: A group of courses that a student must study, choosing from within the specified set, provided that they complete the required number of credit hours designated for this group. It is important for the student to study these elective courses to fulfill the requirements of the bachelor's degree. The number on the right indicates the total hours the student must study from this group, while the number on the left indicates the hours the student has completed. For example, $1-2$ means the student has completed 1 credit hour out of a total of 2 credit hours, leaving 1 credit hour to be completed in this group of courses. This plan includes 5 independent groups of elective courses,

 meaning the student must complete the required number of credit hours specified for each group.
